



The sugar-white beaches of the Florida Panhandle are the result of erosion, the tops of the Appalachian Mountains having washed down to the sea. The same could describe Ronnie McBrayer.

Before making his home along the Gulf of Mexico almost two decades ago, Ronnie was a life-long Georgian - born, raised, and shaped in the Appalachian foothills. Today, his influence extends well beyond the Florida coast - and Appalachia. As the author of multiple books, a spirited speaker, and the writer of the former nationally syndicated column, "Keeping the Faith," Ronnie McBrayer has reached tens of thousands with

his message of grace and God's unconditional love.

For three decades Ronnie has led faith communities, directed non-profits, worked as a hospital chaplain, and provided spiritual direction. He is a certified Enneagram Teacher; a graduate of the Fanning School of the University of Georgia; and has studied Theology (M.Th) and Post-Christianity (D.Min) extensively.

Ronnie especially connects with those who are recovering from unhealthy religion, those who are reconstructing or integrating their changing faith, and those who have more questions than answers. Ronnie believes that love is the end of all things, that "travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness," and those who feel exiled from faith can find a way home - even if that home is somewhere they have never been before.
